BERKSHIRE DOWNS & CHILTERNS GOLDEN RETRIEVER CLUB—HOW IT ALL STARTED

The Golden Retriever Breed blossomed in the late sixties and seventies. At one of the GRC Annual General Meetings around 1972 there was some discussion about setting up branches or areas, much on the lines of the United Retriever Club. However, this did not find favour and the matter was dropped.

In the early seventies, there were moves in many areas of the country to form local Golden Retriever Clubs. In 1970 there were four Clubs, GRC, GRC of Scotland, GRC of Wales, Northern Golden Retriever Association. By 1976 there were 7 clubs, by 1977 there were 11 Clubs, and to-day there are 13 Clubs and a Breed Council.

There was a lot of activity in this area to form a Club. At my instigation, Elsie Henbest, Liz Borrow and I made efforts to gain support to form a new Club. We were joined by Mr & Mrs Tripptree, Aisla Dewar, Mr & Mrs Iles (Jimmy became Chairman), Moira Burden, Kathy Honess (later Chairman), Mary Jones, Peter Cullen (later Secretary) and Lou Melville.

There is a long process, to collect together and form a basic membership, decide the aims of the Club, write rules which everyone agreed to, and to arrive at a name which reflected the area. This was in the days before mobile phones, computers and emails, which considerably slowed the process. I remember writing the rules out long hand on a sheet of paper, and then typing them a number of times to incorporate all the amendments. We communicated by post – how old fashioned and slow is that!

Eventually, we had an inaugural meeting, and applied to register our new Club, We had to be sponsored by two Clubs, including one Breed Club, and we were fortunate to be sponsored by the GRC of Scotland and Windsor Gundog Society (of which I was Chairman!).

In 1977 the Club was up and running. Due to personal circumstances, I had no further part in the running and evolution of the Club.

I have written this from memory, and think it is a fairly accurate account of how the Club began.

Animal Health Trust Glaucoma project

Notes taken by Dawn Rose, from a talk by James Oliver and Dr Cathryn Mellersh.

'Primary glaucoma is a painful and blinding disease associated with high eye pressure. The disease affects over 40 breeds of dog worldwide and at least 1,500 dogs in the UK each year. Treatment is usually unsuccessful and most affected dogs ultimately require removal of their eyes on welfare grounds.' Taken from the AHT website 2015

As many people may be aware the AHT are researching the incidence of Glaucoma in the Golden Retriever and James Oliver is the lead ophthalmologist in charge and is working with Dr Cathryn Mellersh. They have been testing dogs at shows and collecting DNA samples to isolate the genes responsible.

Glaucoma is a painful and life affecting condition where the fluid around the eye is unable to drain and causes pressure to build up in the eye. This almost always leads to the eye having to be removed and often it will attack both eyes leading to both eyes being removed and leaving the dog totally blind.

James Oliver has been testing dogs for goniodysgenesis which is an early indicator of the possibility of Glaucoma and by taking DNA swabs they hope to be able to isolate the genes which cause this disease and help breeders in the future to eradicate it.

It is difficult to assess how many dogs it affects as there is no system of reporting diagnosed dogs to a central register and so this research will also enable us to quantify if it is a numerically significant problem in the breed. From the research done on Goldens so far 217 dogs have been tested and DNA swabbed and 69 of these dogs are affected which gives a prevalence of 31.8%in Golden Retrievers from the sample taken.

Research has been undertaken in a number of other breeds and there is a new test developed for PGBV which was launched at Crufts 2015. They are working on 'fine tooth combing' samples from WSS and Flat Coated Retrievers at the moment and once tests have been developed for those breeds it is hoped that research will continue faster to develop DNA tests for all other breeds where it is a significant factor.

What can we do?

There are three types of dog that are useful to the research:

- i) Dogs of any breed that have been diagnosed by a veterinary ophthalmologist as affected by goniodysgenesis
- ii) Dogs of any breed that have been diagnosed with primary glaucoma by a veterinary ophthalmologist
- ii) Dogs of any breed that have been examined by a veterinary ophthalmologist at the age of five or greater and are clear of goniodysgenesis
